Music – Thursday, July 27 - Brigitte Boisjoli (8 p.m.)

Intoxicating, effervescent, heartwarming, fascinating, incarnating ... there are many adjectives for Brigitte Boisjoli's talent and endearing personality. A rare kind of performer, she successfully poured her ardour and colour into the songs of her first two records—Fruits défendus (2011) and Sans regret (2014)—as she would with the fresh new takes of her subsequent three records—Patsy Cline (2015), Signé Plamondon (2017), and Women (2019).

In May 2022, she came out with 'Mens-moi,' the first excerpt from her next album, slated for release in spring 2023. This piece, a good preview of her future opus, has been soaring on the radio charts. In January 2023, she released a second excerpt 'Partir.'

Music – Thursday, August 3 - Étienne Drapeau – Le show latino (8 p.m.)

Have fun and dance to the most popular and frenzied tunes of international Latino-pop! Étienne Drapeau will perform classics by Ricky Martin, Santana, Enrique Iglesias, Marc Anthony, Elvis Crespo, and many others, in addition to offering some of the greatest hits from his own repertoire and sung in Spanish.

Of Guinean and Indigenous parentage (Huron-Wendat Nation), Joseph Sarenhes intuitively creates a mix that is both consistent and refreshing, somewhere between tradition and current trends. His style is sometimes hip hop, sometimes rock, and sometimes R&B, while incorporating traditional Afro-First Nation elements. He pours his soul into the piano, the guitar, and African drumming, thereby creating a thrilling and unbelievably energetic ambiance, to which he adds his voice and message.

2023 Révélation Radio-Canada, he shapes his music into a unifying medium that will inspire and positively impact young people from Indigenous and other communities.

Music – Saturday, August 5 – Waahli (8 p.m.)

Waahli is a Montreal artist whose parents were born in Haiti. Raised in a family where music was always present, he heard traditional Haitian melodies while in the cradle and taught himself to play the guitar. Despite many influences from Haitian music, he went on to develop his own style through hip hop.

With the tempo of his roots, his breathtaking demonstrations of beatboxing, and his well-honed gift of speech, Waahli offers an alternative hip hop that will carry you off to the four corners of the world. Sung in English, French, and Haitian Creole, his songs are a lively, upbeat intersectionality of rap, Afrobeat, and Haitian culture.

He is one of the 2023 Révélations Radio-Canada.

Music – Sunday, August 6 - Yordan Martinez & The Cuban Martinez Show (3 p.m.) Founded in 2010, this popular Montreal band is renowned for its interactive, Caribbean-flavored shows. Led by Cuban trombonist and arranger Yordan Martinez, The Cuban Martinez Show offers an energetic, spontaneous and rhythmic musical experience!

True to their roots, these artists offer a show of traditional Cuban and Afro-Cuban music, with powerful, jazz-influenced arrangements! Very active on the Quebec scene, the band travels to the finest cabarets and concert halls, as well as to parties and festivals all over the province. Their show is a must for lovers of Cuba and of world music.

Music – Thursday, August 10 – Le Band à Boivin (7 p.m.) In partnership with Radio-Canada

A francophone rock group from the Quebec City area, Le Band à Boivin was founded in 2011 by their leader Marc-André Boivin. Their first album, 60 minutes avant la fin, was launched in 2014. The group became popular through its politically flavoured songs and its raw, direct style of rock. Everything fell into place in 2018 with the release of a second album Atterrissage forcé—an even heavier opus that includes collaborations with the rappers Webster and Rich Hard from Black Taboo.

In recent years, the band has also produced four Christmas songs, which have raked in nearly \$100,000 for the *Corporation du Noël des enfants - le cadeau du savoir* (the gift of knowledge). The money was raised for young people from less fortunate families to help them stay in school. This autumn, Le Band à Boivin will launch a third album: *Tout va pour le mieux dans le meilleur des mondes*.

Music - Thursday, August 10 - Martin Deschamps (8 p.m.)

This unwavering rocker, known for his spirit and powerful voice, will be presenting a new "southwest" style of show. You'll discover a delightful mix of genres—rock, blues, and country! Inspired by his favourite southern rock groups, Deschamps proudly adds a "rural" touch to his compositions through words that portray images from life and through music that speaks to his roots.

He'll get you dancing and singing in a very festive mood with his best hits—some new pieces, and lots of "spicy" old ones! Join the party!

Family (in French) - Saturday, August 12 - Marimba (2 p.m.)

Through a medley of children's songs, Marimba will present the many wacky characters who inhabit her colourful imaginary world. The songs are from her first album, released in early 2022. Always dynamic, she introduces each song with humour and fantasy, and the audience is invited to dance and sing along. A funfilled and entertaining activity!

History (in French) – Saturday, August 12 - Tall tales (8 p.m.)

Through the tall tales of storytellers Francis Désilets, Marc-André Fortin, and Jean-Philippe Marcotte, you'll discover the hard, tumultuous life of Quebec City's 19th century inhabitants and why, in those days, it was not advisable to sleep outdoors on the Plains of Abraham.

The Outsiders will be jazzing up a series of hits, including 'Suite Madame Blue,' 'Show me the Way,' and 'Babe.' There's also going to be a guest vocalist who will stay true to the melody and words with a voice like Denys De Young in his prime.

Music – Saturday, August 19 - Scott-Pien Picard (8 p.m.)

From the North Shore community of Uashat Mak Maliotenam, this author/composer/performer composes his songs in Innu, his mother tongue, a rich and vivid language. In his youth he felt inspired by the groups Maten and Kashtin, developed a passion for music, and began strumming the guitar. In 2015, he was on the Montreal TV program Le Rythme 3, directed by Samian. For some years now, he has taken part in Nikamun

Mamuitun (Songs that bring people together), a superb get-together for Indigenous and non-Indigenous artists.

Scott-Pien Picard has been active on the Indigenous music scene, performing in many communities across Quebec. He was recently crowned Le Talent Bleu du Québec by the audience of the program La Semaine des 4 Julie, and in March 2022 he released his second album. He delivers a lively folk performance and is inviting you to discover the depth and diversity of Innu culture.
